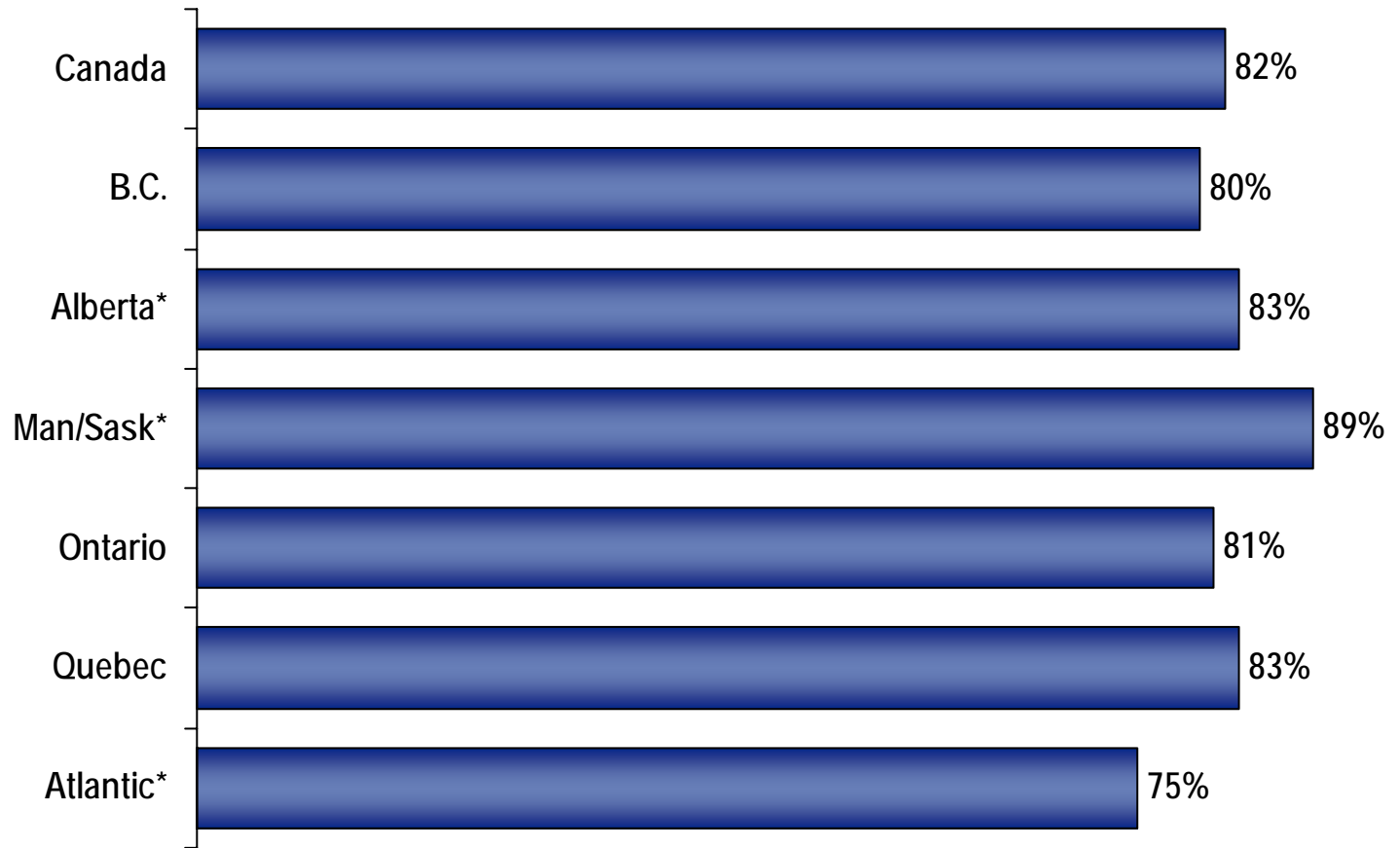




The majority of non-retired Canadians would continue to work even if they had enough money to retire



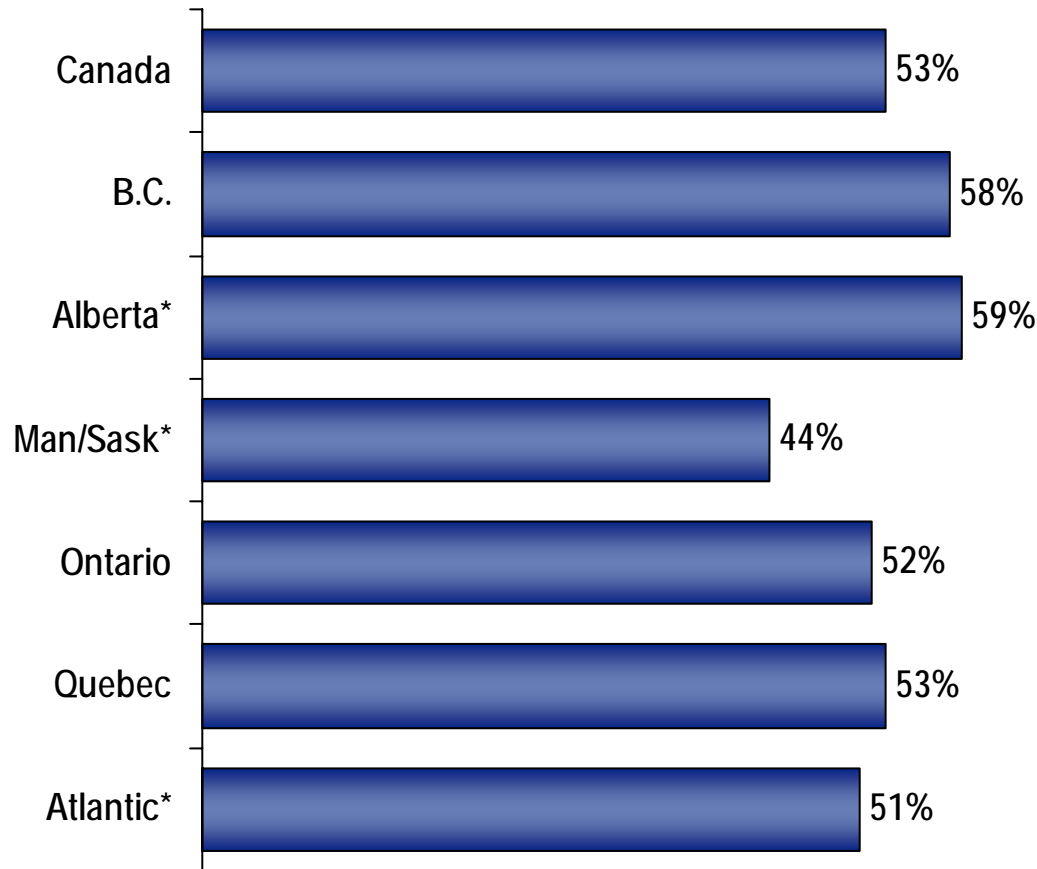
QB2C. If you had enough money today, would you...?: Continue to work; Retire but continue to work part-time/occasionally

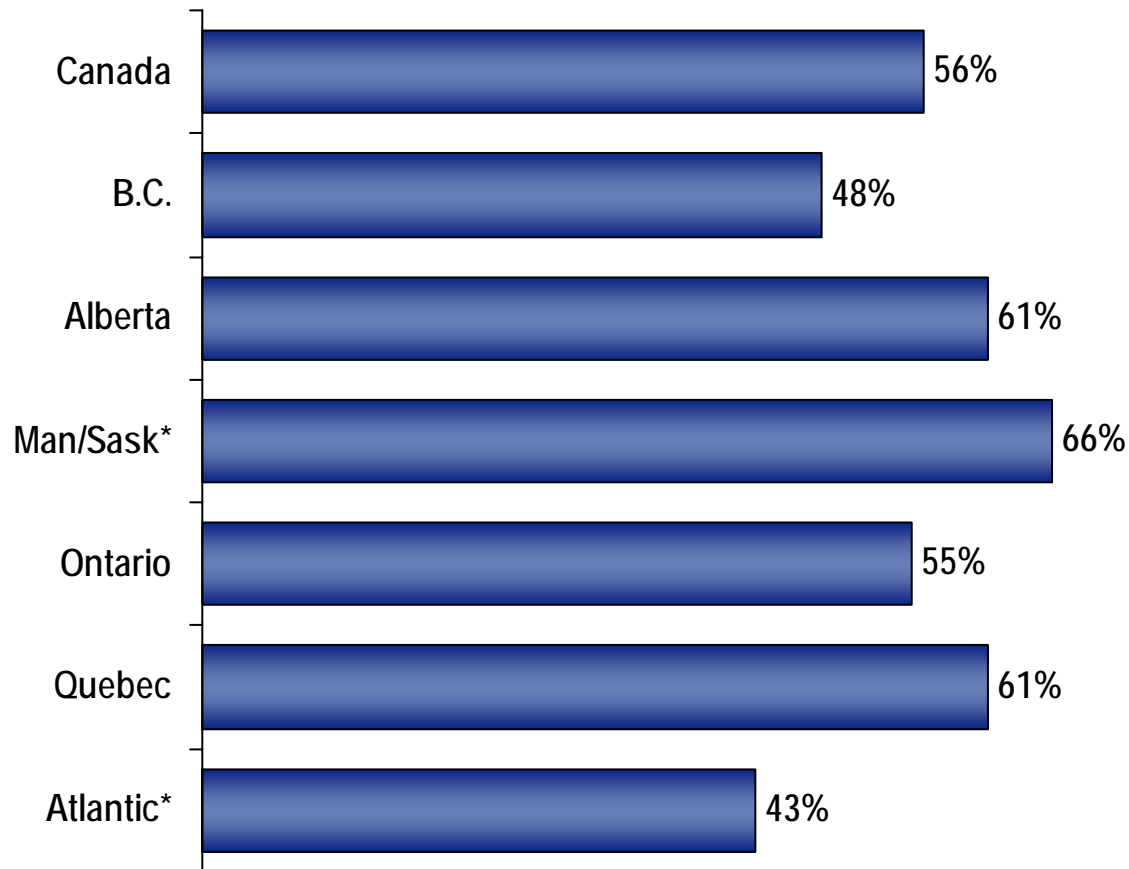
Half of non-retired Canadians would work part-time or occasionally even if they had enough money to retire

More than half of Canadians plan to continue working as long as possible.

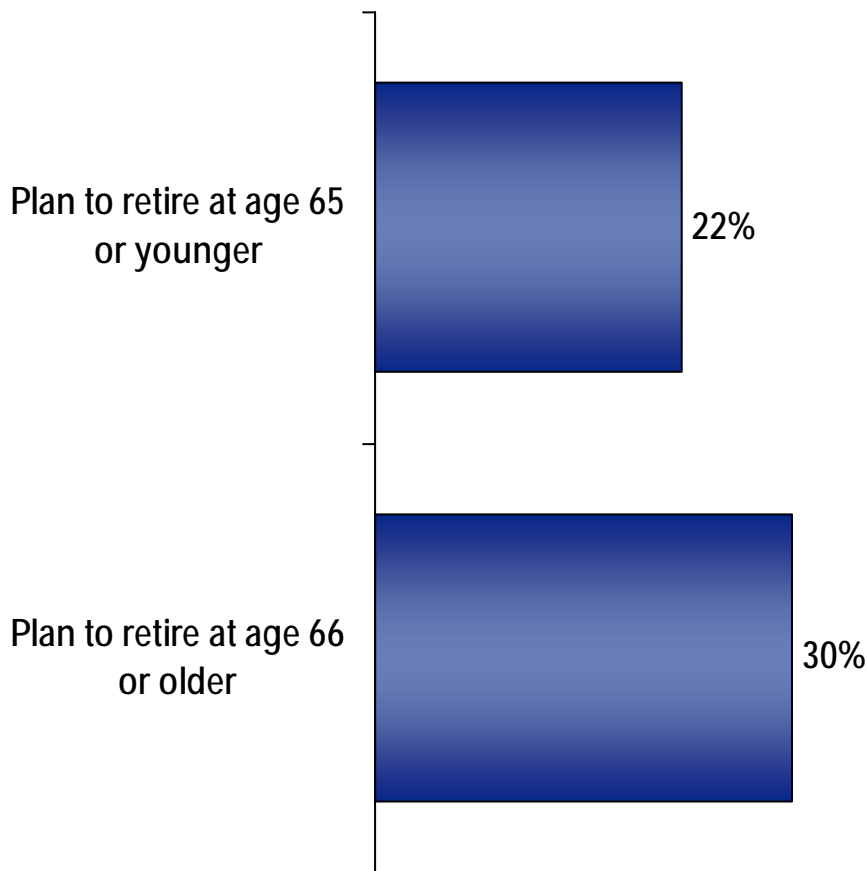

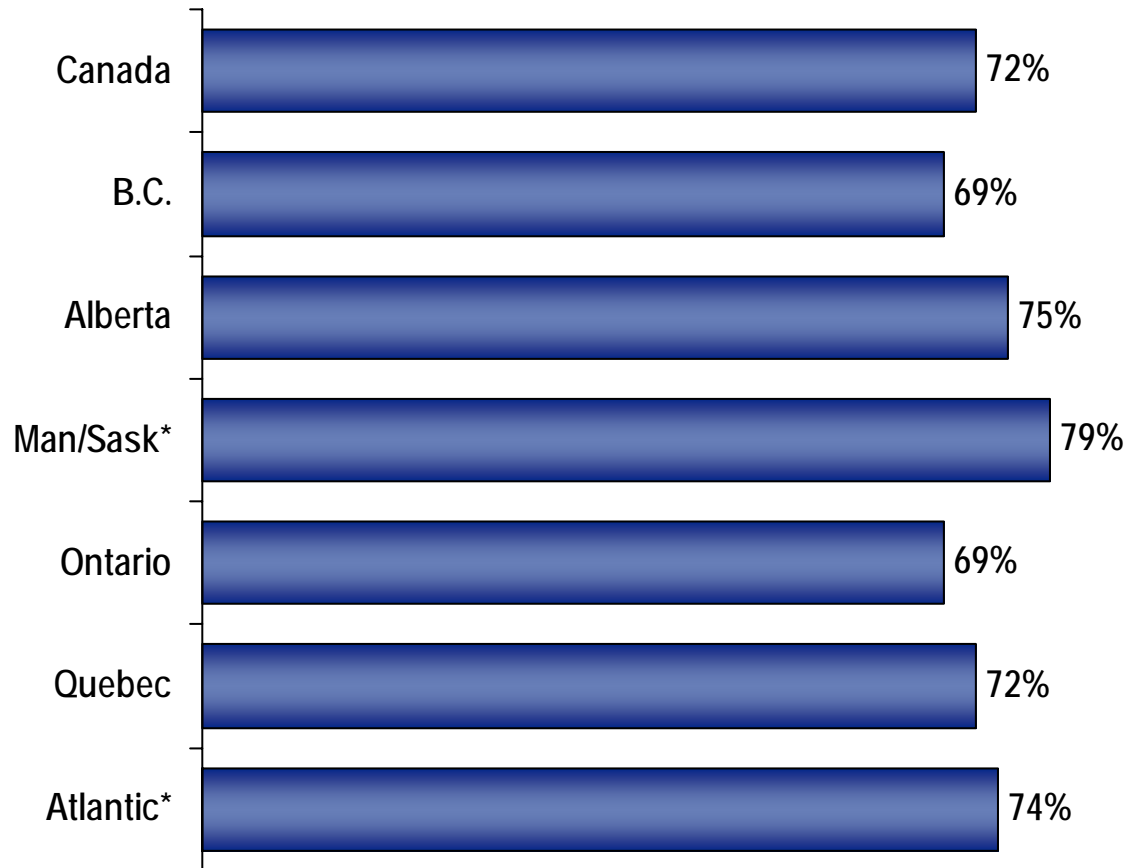


QG5A. Do you expect to have to support anyone in your retirement. Responses of 'Yes'.
