



Among hockey fans, six in ten (56%) say that hockey will remain a part of their life given an NHL lockout, while four in ten (44%) say it won't.






Overall, nearly nine in ten (86%) believe that local hockey will <u>NOT</u> be negatively affected by an NHL lockout.

Local Hockey Affected?





Among hockey fans, majority (61%) would get their fix by going to a Major Junior game, while a slim minority (45%) would choose local hockey.





To replace hockey, Canadians will spend more time with friends and family (35%) or watch other sports (30%). Younger Canadians (43%) are most likely to replace time spent watching hockey with spending more time with friends and family, while men (46%, +30 pts. vs. Women) are much more likely to watch other sports.
