On Saturday, August 30, 2014, discussions between British Columbia's provincial government and the British Columbia Teachers' Federation (BCTF) came to an impasse. As a result, classes did not resume as planned, Tuesday, September 2, and the union's president was unable to provide any indication of when teachers may return to the classroom.
