As of this morning, Friday, July 4, 2014, the centre of Hurricane Arthur is moving near North Carolina's coast after slashing into the state's barrier islands, forcing thousands to flee and much of the East Coast to shuffle Independence Day celebrations. Arthur strengthened to a Category 2 storm with sustained winds of 155 kilometres per hour Thursday evening before passing over the southern end of the Outer Banks. It has now been downgraded to a Category 1, and clean-up will soon begin.

Storm-tracking models show Arthur moving up the U.S. east coast toward the Maritimes throughout the day Friday, and it's expected to become a strong post-tropical storm with sustained winds of 65 km/h or more when it arrives late Friday or early Saturday. Meteorologists also predict plenty of rain, including a possible 100 millimetres in parts of New Brunswick. Officials are warning residents to secure loose objects on their property and brace for power interruptions.
